Fourth Sunday of each month is Food Pantry Sunday. Bring in your non-perishable food items and place them in the container in the entrance hallway.


A sign-up sheet is now on the Mission and Ministry Table for you to sign up to volunteer your time to help cut the grass here at FIC. We need your help!

Modern interpretation of sin:

1 Timothy 1:15 Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the worst.

The comments presented here are just my observations. They are not meant to cast stones upon or judge anyone. I am new to the concept of Biblical teachings and like many others I sometimes get confused. Having said that, let's pretend that we are rewriting the Bible with an eye on the concept of



sin as defined in today's world. Perhaps it will shed some light on my confusion. (Should we wonder why the youth of today are confused?)

In Genesis God commanded Adam and Eve not to eat the forbidden fruit. However, they did it anyway and God knew they ate the fruit. Adam and Eve where confronted with the truth, so it would be like Adam and Eve got caught in the act. Getting caught is an important aspect in today's world because most sinners do not ask for forgiveness unless they are caught. And even then, they do as Adam and Eve did by blaming someone else for their actions and then, they and their friends will simply say, "yes, we saw the fruit and we ate some of it, SO WHAT, it's no big deal!" (Gen: 3:11)

Then there's that golden calf thing at the bottom of Mt. Sinai. I suppose God wouldn't have been anywhere near as upset if they would have just told him, "We were only having a little FUN, nobody got hurt, what's the big deal?" (Exodus 32:1)

I'm fairly certain by today's standards that Solomon would actually cut the baby in half, just to be fair. (1 Kings 3:24) Today, fairness seems to be defined by those who think they've been slighted somehow and need to put some of their own agony on someone else.

It is difficult for me to understand how, in my "short" lifetime, sin is not only being redefined, but we are expected to not only tolerate the new definition, but also openly welcome it. It doesn't seem to matter that there are some things the Bible mentions over and over and OVER as sin. This includes a variety of subjects, not just one.

I have noticed that some of those who wish to create these new definitions will use Biblical text to make more convincing arguments. For example I have heard it said many times from non-Bible believers that we are not to be "judgmental." Jesus does in fact tell us in **Matthew 7:1-2** "Do not judge, or you too will be judged" and "For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." Did Jesus mean for us to ignore the sin of others simply because we too are sinners?

John 8:5 reminds us of the story of a prostitute and how she was going to be stoned for her sin. In this story Jesus says those who are without sin may cast the first stone and of course no one did. He also would not cast any stones. However, He told the prostitute to "go and sin no more." So it would seem then that Jesus forgave the woman for her sin but also reminded her that what she did was in fact sin and to stop doing it. Today she would just be another member of the working class called a sex worker.

When we reach a point that sin of any description becomes commonplace, will we still be able to recognize any of our own sins? (It must be OK cause everybody's doing it.) And when we can't recognize any sin, would we be able to recognize our Savior?

Can anyone relieve my confusion and convince me that God will accept this as an excuse? Especially when God gave us His Son to die for our sins? (John 3:16, 17). Jesus is just TOO important.

What do you think?

Notebook and pencil

Ruler

Scissors – one for fabric, one for paper

4 different fall style and color fabrics for block front:

4 ½ inches wide for leaf design

4 ½ inches wide for first border

9 inches wide for second border and block background

4 ½ inches for third border

1/2 yard fabric for block backing

Matching thread

Quilting needles if hand sewing

Straight pins

Post It note pad – 3" size
